**Admission to Teacher Education Program requirements**

Minimum GPA of 2.75

Core Academic Skills for Educators (CASE) tests—Math 150, reading 156, and Writing 162. (Any PPST tests passed prior to Sept. 1, 2014 may be used: Scores – Reading – 176, Math 174, and Writing 174.)

OR

ACT composite score of 22 or higher,

24 or more credit hours including a "B" or better in ENG 105, MAT 117, COM 161, and more
